For the regulation and administration of these libraries in Uttar Pradesh, 'Public Libraries Act' came into existence in the year 2006. Consequently, Public Libraries in every district are being run by professionally qualified District Librarians and supervised at state level by highly qualified OSD Libraries under the jurisdiction of Madhyamik Siksha Department.

There is a pressing need to rejuvenate the 'Public Libraries' in Uttar Pradesh which are marred by the various short comings and incorporate the traditional libraries with these features.

Thus, together in a combined effort we must aim to significantly contribute to this initiative for uplifting the Public Library system and make this turn into reality.
