Mrs. Sweta Dave (Convener) presented the brief report of the seminar. The certificates were distributed and the best papers were awarded by Research Link Award by Dr. Ramesh Soni, Editor, Research Link, Indore (M.P.).

Outcomes of the seminar – The participants were enriched in their area by expert talks, group discussion and presentations in the seminar.

Recommendation and Suggestions-

All aspects of curriculum development were major outcomes of the seminar are as follows:

- 1. UGC should frame common syllabus for UG and PG classes in each stream throughout the country.
- 2. The syllabus and evaluation pattern of PG level should be similar to the level of NET/SET exam, so that student should not require private coaching for competitive exam.
- 3. Vocational courses should be included in curriculum for enhancing employability skills.
- 4. Capacity building of teachers should be given due weightage. The teachers should be provided orientation & refresher courses timely so that they may be aware with recent advancements in technology and global changes.
- 5. ICT plays an important role in higher education so it should be a part of all curriculum including language courses and teacher should also be provided training on basic computer techniques.
- 6. Concerned authorities should timely recruit regular faculties in vacant positions of govt. and private institutions since teachers are backbone of education system.
- 7. It should be made mandatory by state and central government to get NAAC accreditation for availing grants, so that institution should work for betterment and quality education.
- 8. Choice based credit system and semester system should be advocated as it covers syllabus in definite time span.
- 9. Distribution of marks in evaluation and examination (internal and external) should be rationalized and continuous and comprehensive evaluation type of assessment be followed for internal marks at all level.
- 10. Integrating modern technology of teaching in the curriculum.
- 11. Academic wing must be qualified capable of taking the responsibilities for framing curriculum.
- 12. Curriculum should be designed to cover both theoretical and practical aspects of the subjects.
- 13. Student feedback should be considered while framing the curriculum.

- 14. Stakeholders from industries or relevant sectors should be included in the board of studies for designing curriculum.
- 15. Curriculum should be restructured and redesigned timely to include global reform and innovations.

Follow up Actions

As a follow up activity we intend to send the resources and ideas obtained by the presentations to the concerned authorities.
