```
usermod [options] username
```



usermod command

- Used to modify the attributes of an already created user account
- **Syntax:**
`usermod [options] username`
- `options` **part is not mandatory**

- **First we have to create these two groups**

- **You should use `-a` option**

- a **option denotes** append



Changing Home Directory

- We can change the home directory for the user `radha` with the help of `usermod` command



Changing Home Directory

- The syntax to change the home directory of user `radha` to the directory named `testmod` is



Changing Home Directory

- The syntax to change the home directory of user `radha` to the directory named `testmod` is
- `usermod -m -d /home/testmod radha`



Changing Home Directory

- **-d: Modify the directory for any existing user account**



Changing Home Directory

- **-d:** Modify the directory for any existing user account
- **-m:** Moves the contents of the existing home directory to the new home directory



Important Note



Important Note

- We should write `-d` option immediately after the new directory name



Important Note

- We should write `-d` option immediately after the new directory name
- Else we will get an error



usermod -L

- It will lock only the access to password



usermod -L

- It will lock only the access to password
- If you wish to lock the account itself, you should also set the expiry date to 1



usermod -L(Cont.)

- **Type**

```
usermod -L -e 1 <username>
```



usermod -L(Cont.)

- **Type**

```
usermod -L -e 1 <username>
```

- **It will prevent the user from logging in from any other source including ssh**
