- It can also be used to add members, delete members, give administrative rights, etc.



gpsswd

- **The syntax is:**

`gpsswd [option] groupname`



gpasswd

- The syntax is:
`gpasswd [option] groupname`
- Here option field is not mandatory



Add Five Users:

We will add five new users to the system using `adduser` command

Username	Password	Name
abhishek	pass_abhishek	Abhishek
ashok	pass_ashok	Ashok
anushka	pass_anushka	Anushka
asha	pass_asha	Asha
anshu	pass_anshu	Anshu



Group Administrator

- Who can add and remove users from that group

Group Administrator

- Who can add and remove users from that group
- Change the password of the group
- There can be more than one administrator for a group



Group Member



Group Member

- Can access the group without being prompted for a password



Group Member

- Can access the group without being prompted for a password
- We specify administrators and members as lists of usernames



System Administrator Can Use

- **-A: To add one or more group administrator(s)**



System Administrator Can Use

- **-A: To add one or more group administrator(s)**
- **-M: To add one or more group member(s)**



System Administrator Can Use

- **-A: To add one or more group administrator(s)**
- **-M: To add one or more group member(s)**
- **Can use both -A and -M together in a single command**



Add a New User in the group

- Do not use `-M` to add a new member to the existing member list



Add a New User in the group

- Do not use `-M` to add a new member to the existing member list
- It will replace the existing member list



Add a New User in the group

- We have `-a` option for this purpose



Add a New User in the group

- We have `-a` option for this purpose
- A user can be added to a group by a super user or a group administrator



Remove a User from Group

- **-d option for this purpose**



Remove a User from Group

- **-d option for this purpose**
- **This option can be used to delete one user at a time**



Remove a User from Group

- **-d option for this purpose**
- **This option can be used to delete one user at a time**
- **Both super user or group administrator can remove a user from the group**



Restrict the access to a group

- Only group members will be allowed to use `newgrp` command to join the group



Restrict the access to a group

- Only group members will be allowed to use `newgrp` command to join the group
- For this, we have to use `-R` option



Note while using gpasswd

- **Except for -A and -M options, others options cannot be combined**



Note while using gpasswd

- Except for `-A` and `-M` options, others options cannot be combined
- Group administrator does not have permission to use `gpasswd` command with `-A` or `-M`
