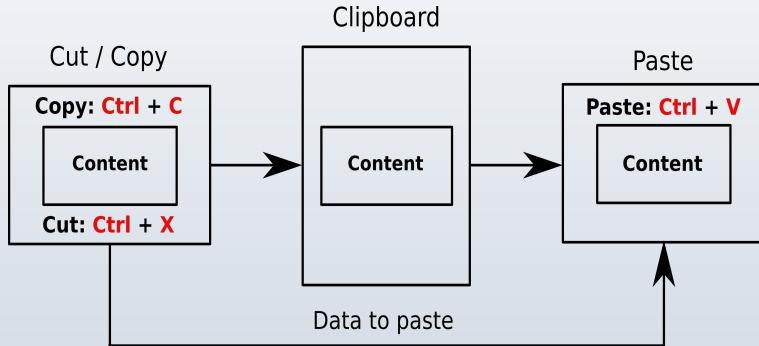

- **gedit Text editor allows to Undo any changes that are made in the file**



Undo

- **gedit Text editor allows to Undo any changes that are made in the file**
- **It erases the last change done to the document**



Undo

- Useful when you have made a mistake and want to Undo it



Undo

- Useful when you have made a mistake and want to Undo it
- The keyboard shortcut for **Undo** is **Ctrl + Z**



Redo

- The opposite of Undo is Redo



Redo

- The opposite of Undo is Redo
- The Redo command reverses the Undo action



Redo

- The opposite of Undo is Redo
- The Redo command reverses the Undo action
- The keyboard shortcut for Redo is Shift + Ctrl + Z



Search

- It's difficult to search for a particular word in a file, that has hundred lines of text.



Search

- It's difficult to search for a particular word in a file, that has hundred lines of text.
- Search function allows to search for one or all instances of the word, in the entire document
