- ◆ It is free/Libre and open source software
- ◆ It helps teachers and educators to create an online courses for adaptive and customized learning
- ◆ It is used by many small and large educational institutions to create and deliver courses online to their students

Download and Installation

Prerequisites for installing Moodle

- ◆ To install Moodle 3.3, the machine should support:
 - ◆ Apache 2.x (or higher version)
 - ◆ MariaDB 5.5.30 (or any higher version)
 - ◆ PHP 5.4.4 +(or any higher version)
- ◆ Add user and create a database for Moodle using phpMyadmin
- ◆ Start XAMPP service

Installing Moodle on Local Server

- ◆ Download Moodle from <https://download.moodle.org>

Features

- ◇ Moodle works on Linux, Windows and Mac operating systems
- ◇ Moodle is easy to navigate on all devices
- ◇ The security controls keep our data safe and protected
- ◇ It has powerful features that empower both teachers and learners
- ◇ The Moodle user community and forum very active and helpful
- ◇ Free plugins available in Moodle make it feature-rich
- ◇ It has detailed reports on activity and participation at course and site level
- ◇ It helps in collaborative as well as personalized learning
- ◇ It has basic features such as file upload, assignments, quizzes, notifications, etc.
- ◇ Advanced features such as forums, wikis, etc. can be used by learners
